Notes for Study on the Death of Jesus

The Need for a Sacrifice

Jesus is the “propitiation” – Romans 3:5, I John 2:2  
Romans 8:1 – “...law of sin and death...”

The Palm Sunday entry (Matthew 21:9)

Jesus wept over the city – “O Jerusalem, Jerusalem...” Matthew 23:37

Jesus last week in Jerusalem

The Passover Lamb comes to be examined (Mark 12:34)

The raising of Lazarus and the Cleansing of the Temple make death inevitable (John 12:10)

A sense in which Jesus seems to be provocative – causing things to happen

Teaching in the Temple every day (Mark 11:15-19)

Evenings at Bethany (the home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus)

The Passover meal and the Last Supper (Matthew 22:19-23)

Footwashing – “ye ought also to wash one another’s feet” (John 13)

Gethsemane – victory prayer (Matthew 26)

The arrest

Judas’ betrayal (Luke 22:1-6)

Peter’s denial (Luke 22:54 )

The three trials (almost four)

Jewish trial

Bribed witnesses could not agree

Before Pilate – warned by his wife, he seeks to “pass the buck”

Before Herod – no sincerity in Herod’s heart. (He was Jewish)

Before Pilate again (John 19)

“You are no friend of Caesar”

The Scouring

“His blood be on us and on our children”

Pilate’s acquiescence – the sentence of death is passed, *without* establishing guilt!

The Crucifixion (John 19)

Between the two thieves

The Roman government killed Jesus, not the Jews (technically)

Events at the crucifixion (John 19)

Mocking and ridicule

Gambling for his clothes

Crown of Thorns

The sign over his head – “The King of the Jews”

Mary commended to John’s care

“Father forgive them”

Earthquake

The centurion’s testimony

Vinegar to drink

“It is finished”

“Father into thy hands I commend my spirit”

The burial – Joseph’s new tomb (John 19)
